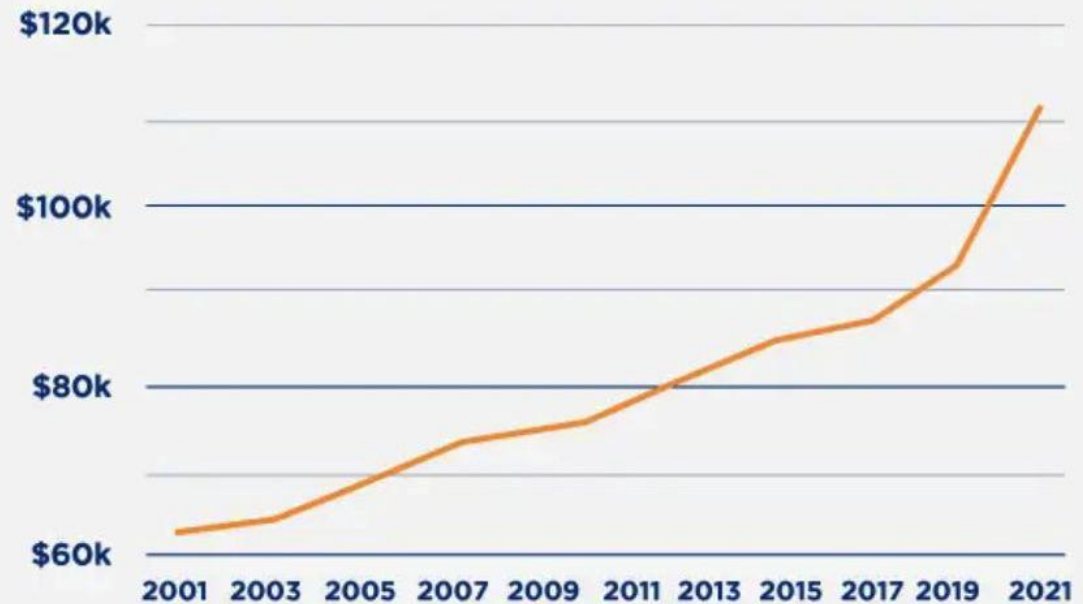

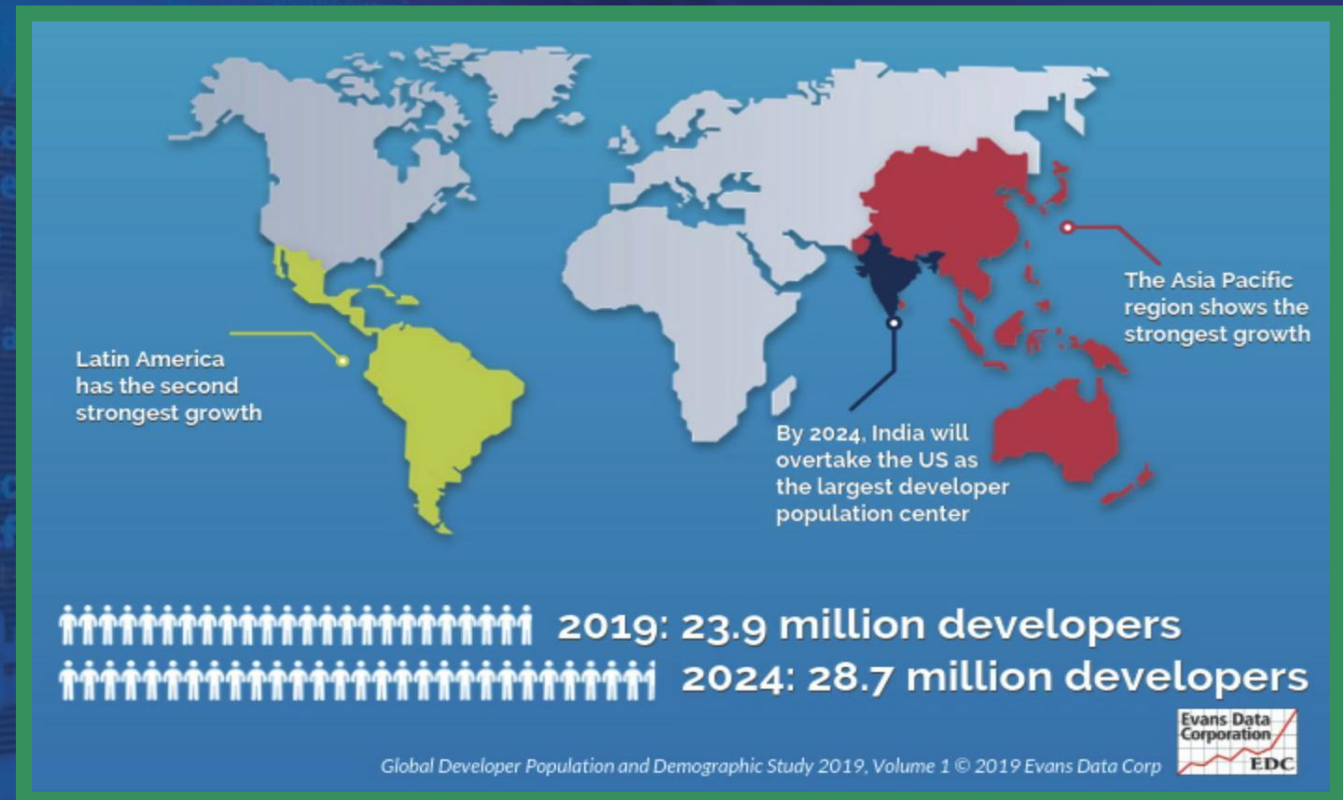

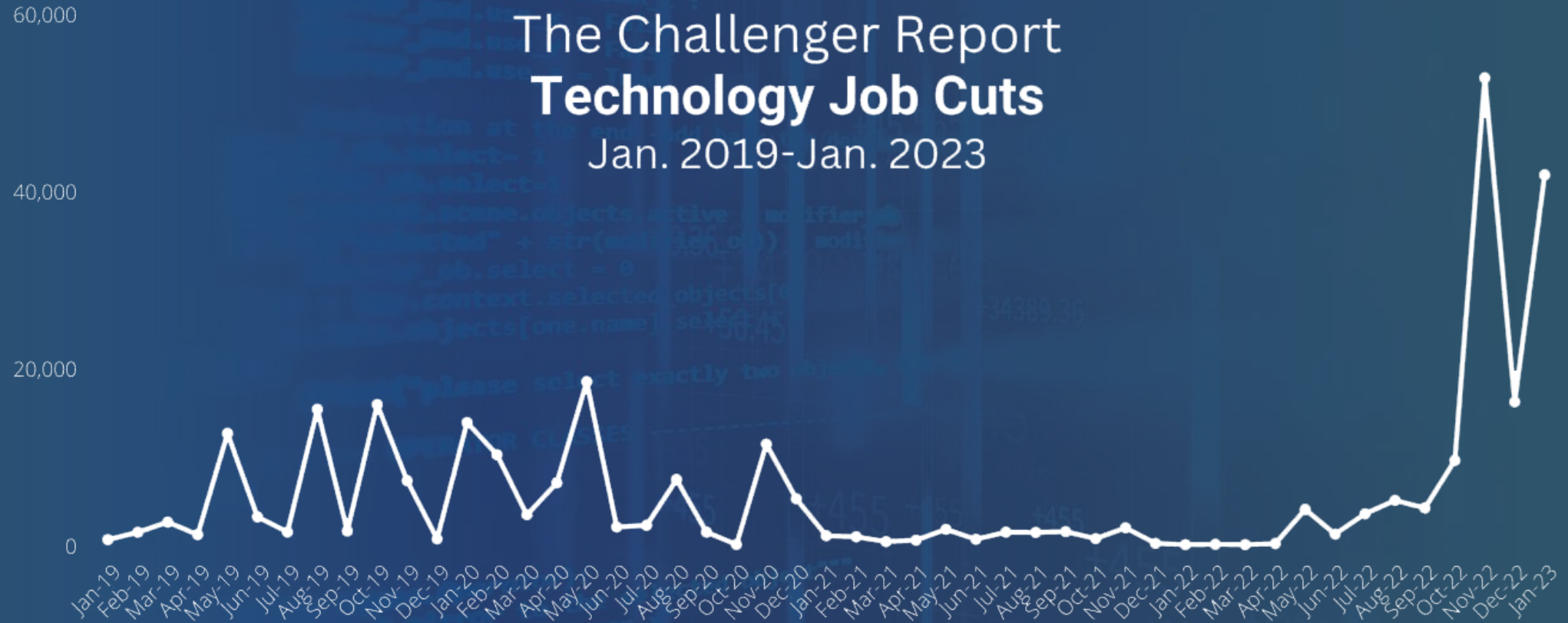

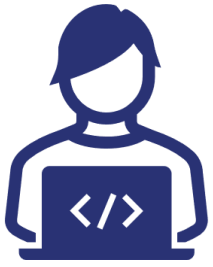

Why are Tech Layoffs Happening?

Hiring Frenzy

Over-hiring during COVID-19—the pandemic and the behaviors it cultivated, such as remote work and buying groceries online, prompted tech companies to hire rapidly and aggressively.

Maturation of Tech Industry

Tech companies may not be on pace to acquire as many new customers since many people have already adopted their services. Instead, tech companies may be looking beyond growth and into diversifying products or expanding globally.

Possible Recession

Digital advertisers are cutting back on spending and rising inflation is curbing consumer spending.

Investor Pressure to Manage Headcount

Layoffs are a tried-and-true tactic to appease investors that want action. USA Today says, "It's not that big techs are running short on cash, but they're making huge investments into risky new business areas. And these things have gotten a lot more expensive to fund. So, they're pulling back." ⁽⁸⁾

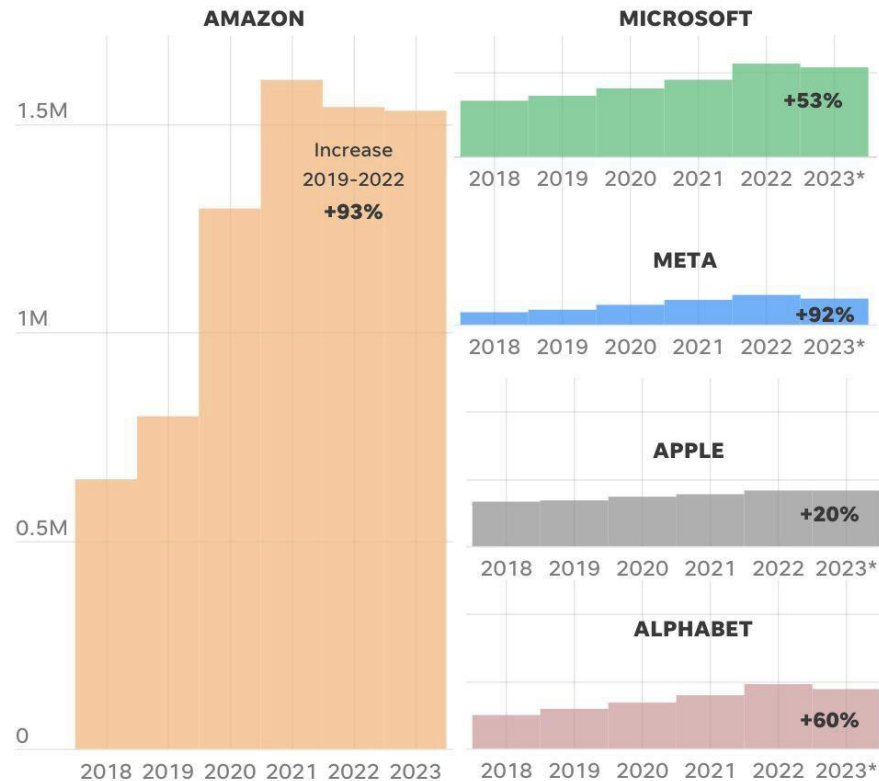

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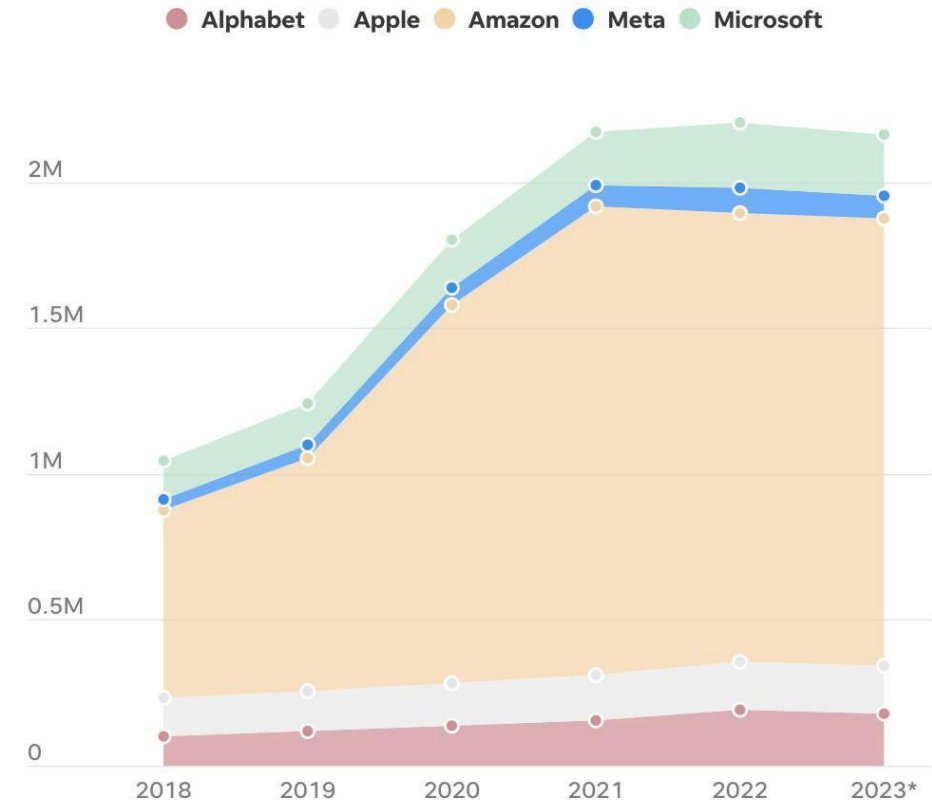


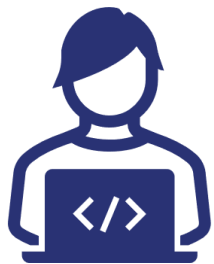

Less Competition within Hiring Market

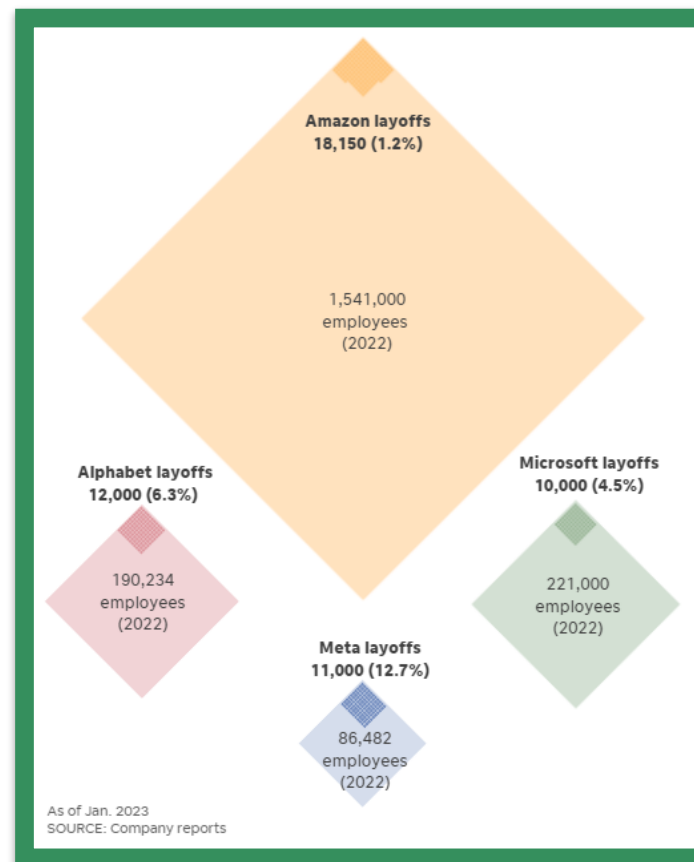
Tech employees are being reabsorbed into the market and therefore competition with Big Tech firms has decreased for Small to Midsize Businesses.

Tech Unemployment is Decreasing

Tech employment is decreasing from 1.8% to 1.5% in December 2022.

Big Tech Represents a Small Share of Tech Companies' Workforces

Layoffs are never positive, but the top 5 Big Tech companies are a relatively small share of all workforces for Tech companies.





What to Expect for 2023

Hiring Will Continue

There are more than 375,000 tech jobs in the US that need to be filled in 2023. 4x as many job openings as there have been layoffs.
